Seams: -Construction should be smooth and well stitched -Seams should be cleanly pressed with no threads showing	Applique: -Edges should be finished smoothly with consistent stitches, and hidden if intended
Piecing: -Points should be sharp -Intersections should meet evenly and be flat -Curves should be smooth -Paper should all be removed	Border and Sashing Strips: -Stitching should be uniform and evenly spaced -No knots or thread build up -Design marking lines should not be visible -Thread tension should be evenly balanced -Square corners should be 90 degrees

Section G - Flowers and Plants

Rules and Information

- Flowers should be exhibited in a clear glass vase or jar. Try to match the size of the flower with the jar size.
- No artificial support should be used for flowers except for a fern leaf or moss below water level in jar.
EXCEPTION in the FLORAL ART CATEGORIES.
- Flowers with more than one cut required must be of the same variety.
- No foreign substance should be used on flowers or leaves to enhance their appearance. Free of dirt and bugs.
- Flower entries that DO NOT HAVE the right number of stems or cuts for the class will be disqualified.
- **A cut is a single flower on one stalk while a stem consists of several flowers on one stalk.**
- Exhibits will be assessed by their condition at time of judging.
- See Rules and Regulations.
- Please try to ensure that all plants are PEST FREE.

- On label please state if you are a novice with less than four years knitting experience and type of wool used.

- Only quartered, sliced or whole fruits/vegetables accepted.
- Jams or Jellies may or may not be sealed with wax.
- Open Categories consist of product that is not covered in its own category

- Wine must be exhibited, if possible, in clear, round, unpattern bottles.
- Entry forms will be attached to the wine bottle with elastic bands, not tape or glue.
- The same wine may be entered only once in the competition.
- Exhibitors may enter a maximum of (2) bottle in each class.
- State on entry tag the type of wine (fruit, berry, etc.)
- Division between dry and sweet is a specific gravity of 1000
- All wine must be at room temperature at the time of judging.
